Steps to Starting a Small Business from TBC

	Define your business idea, including type of business (home-based, storefront?)
	Choose a business name that is unique and reflects your brand
	Decide on the legal structure (ie., sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation)
	Register your business online at ownr.co
	Research the licences or permits you may require to operate
	Develop your online presence including website, email, social media
	If required, apply for an HST/GST account through the Canada Revenue Agency
	Set up a business bank account
	Develop a bookkeeping system to track income, expenses, and transactions
	Get business insurance - consult with a broker to find the right coverage for you

Important Information for Your New Business



Building Permits

What needs a permit?

Structural, plumbing, or electrical modifications, pool installations, and deck installations must be approved by the Municipality. Approved plans must comply with the Ontario Building Code, local zoning by-laws, and other applicable laws and regulations.




Other Permits

In addition to the municipal permits required, depending on your type of business, other regulatory bodies such as the Health Unit, AGCO, or Fire Department may need to complete inspections before you may begin operations.



Traffic and Parking By-law

The Traffic and Parking By-law is in place for municipal and private parking lots. Businesses should be aware of this by-law as it might affect parking availability near your business location, or the number of spaces you need to ensure you have available.



Sign By-law

If you operate a business at a physical location within Callander, please ensure you are aware of what is and is not allowed in the Sign By-law.

Outdoor Vendor By-law



Callander recently made it a priority to support small business growth in Callander by making it easier for businesses to offer access to their business in a variety of ways, including our new Outdoor Vendor By-law, which now:

- simplified the process for acquiring an outdoor vendor permit
- increased allowances for outdoor patios and sidewalk sales
- allows for mobile food carts in the downtown core
- allows for food trucks on commercial properties, and
- allows for farmers markets on municipal property

Sewer By-law



The sewer By-law affects residents and businesses alike. Grease and oils need to be processed by an interceptor designed to prevent motor oil and lubricating grease from passing into the drainage system. Routine cleaning of these drains is mandatory. Infractions are subject to paying associated costs with clearing a blockage and/or pay fines for repeated offences



FunFest (June/July)

Callander's flagship event takes place end of June/beginning of July. The day offers exciting family fun and entertainment, including a pancake breakfast, concerts, vendors, kids' activities, fireworks, and a parade to celebrate Canada Day! Come join fellow residents for a full day of family fun!

Sirens in the Park (August)

This all-day event is put on for the community to help educate others on fire safety through fun games and demonstrations. It features firetrucks and equipment for display by our local Callander Volunteer Firefighters. It also includes a family-friendly Movie in the Park to top off the day!





Cranberry Day (September/October)

This annual event takes place end of September/beginning of October. During the day, Callander celebrates its natural cranberry forest with fresh cranberry goods, horsewagon rides, vendors, live music, and many fun activities for families at the Cranberry Trail and marsh.

Callander's Safe Halloween (October)

Near the end of October, Callander comes alive with a haunted house, games for all ages, free candy, costume contests, and more! Held at the Callander Community Centre, join fellow residents in a spooktacular evening of family fun.





Callander Lights Up Christmas (December)
