
#### **Passed 417 Resolutions**

#### **15 MFIPPA Requests**

Processed 15 MFIPPA requests, submitted majorly by 1 member of the public, greatly impacting staff resources in the Clerk's Department. 8 remain outstanding and have been carried into 2025. 9 of the MFIPPA requests previously submitted have been appealed.



#### **20 Policy Updates**

Policy updates continue to play a pivotal role in ensuring the direction to staff from Council remains in line with the Strategic Plan. In 2023, there were 17 policy documents created/updated. In 2022, there were only 9.






#### **DEVELOPMENT IN CALLANDER**



In 2023, Council adopted a Housing Action Plan, which involved eliminating Development Charges, modifying language in the Zoning By-law and Official Plan to make it easier for more housing to be constructed.



• Less planning applications, specifically Official Plan and Zoning By-law Amendment applications, due to the housekeeping amendments undertaken in 2024. This was a directive from the Housing Action Plan, to reduce "red tape" associated with development.




- Increase in development due to two key subdivisions coming online:
  - Masson Lane (Osprey Development)
  - Beau Valley
- Changes to Zoning By-law, allowing rural severance applications, has also resulted in additional rural development.
- Elimination of Development Charges in 2023, also assisted in spearheading development.








#### **OPERATIONS**



- Less OT hours attributed to lack of snow in 2024 Winter Season, and the hiring of 1.5 additional Operations Tradesman.
  - Service requests are majorly generated by the public via the website. Many were minor issues that did not trigger a Work Order. Work Orders in 2021-2022 were mostly related to requests for water meter readings, but we've changed practice to read on a monthly basis, eliminating individual requests for water meter reads.
  - Most Work Orders now are for final readings and bill inquiries.









